ESTHER AND EMMETT - Jan 31

(There is a tall pile of books. The top of Emmett's hair can be seen protruding above the books)

Esther: Emmett...are you there?

Emmett: Hi Esther. I'm here (Emmett slides the books to the side so that we can see him).

Esther: There you are. Were you trying to hide?

Emmett: No, I was just getting ready in case anyone came along and asked me to teach them about God.

Esther: Why do you have all those books?

Emmett: Because when people see all these books they'll think I know a lot. They will think that I teach with authority!

Esther: With authority...

Emmett: Just like Jesus.

Esther: You've been reading the Bible haven't you?

Emmett: Yep.

Esther: You've been reading about Jesus teaching in the synagogue in the village of Capernaum, haven't you?

Emmett: I sure have!

Esther: And after Jesus had taught some of the people listening said that he taught...

Emmett: With authority! Wow! Just saying those words makes me feel smarter already!

Esther: So you think that saying someone teaches with authority means that that person is smart?
