Esther and Emmett – Palm Sunday

Esther: Hi Emmett. Are you ready for the parade?

Esther: And now we wave our palm branches and shout "Hosanna!"

Emmett: Hosanna! Hosanna! ...how was that!

Esther: Very good...Hosanna!

Emmett: Uh, Esther, I have a question...

Esther: Sure, what's your question?

Emmett: Why are we yelling 'Hosanna?' I don't suppose it means 'nice donkey!'

Esther: No, 'hosanna' means 'help' or 'save.'

Emmett: Oh...okay...I don't get it. Why were people saying that?

Esther: Well, they didn't only say 'hosanna.' They also said, 'Blessed is the one who comes in the name of God."

Emmett: Oh...okay...l still don't get it! I think I'd have just waved at Jesus.

Esther: People were excited because they believed that Jesus' parade was telling something wonderful!

Emmett: Parades tell us something?

Esther: Yes they do. The yearly Santa Claus parade...

Emmett: Tells us Christmas is here!

Esther: And when a sports team wins a championship sometimes there is a parade to say "We are the champions."

Emmett: Some places have an Easter parade...because Easter is here!!

Esther: Parades contain messages! When Jesus paraded into Jerusalem, the parade said 'God is here!" God is here in the way Jesus cares about people, God is here when people are healed, God is here when food is shared...

Emmett: God is here when someone rides on a nice donkey!

Esther: Yes...because if a king rode into a city on a donkey it meant that the king came in peace.

Emmett: See, I knew we should be yelling 'nice donkey.'

Esther: And, in a way, the Jesus parade was also saying 'we are the champions.'

Emmett: Really...did they have a trophy?

Esther: No, they had a donkey.

Emmett: A nice donkey.

Emmett: And all that stuff that Jesus did!

Esther: Exactly! Being champions for God means loving people as Jesus loved, and that's what can save the world, that's what makes the world be the kind of world God wants it to be!

Emmett: Wow! Then let's shout 'Hosanna!" – but I'm still pretending the donkey jumps over my cloak!

Esther: Blessed is the one who comes from God. Hosanna! Amen!
