Esther and Emmett – February 27 2022

Esther: Hi Emmett. Have you seen how much snow there is outside?

Emmett: Hi Esther. Yes, there sure is a lot of snow. It looks like a mountain of snow in our front yard.

Esther: It sure does...but there are lots of things you can do on a mountain...like skiing.

Emmett: Or tobogganing!

Esther: Or praying!

Emmett: Or...did you say 'praying'?

Esther: Yes, Jesus sometimes went up on a mountain to pray.

Emmett: Jesus went up on a mountain to pray?!!!

Esther: Yes...in fact, this Sunday we will be hearing a Bible story about Jesus going up on a mountain to pray.

Emmett: We will?

Esther: Yes we will, because this Sunday is Transfiguration Sunday.

Emmett: Really! I have a Transformer that can change from a robot into a car!

Esther: That sounds like fun, but this isn't Transformer Sunday. It's Transfiguration Sunday.

Emmett: Sounds like a Sunday when everyone tries to figure out what the name of the Sunday means!!

Esther: Transfiguration is a big word!

Emmett: Is that what happens when people go up a mountain to pray? Do they start saying big words?

Esther: No, Jesus didn't actually say the word 'transfiguration.' The church calls this Transfiguration Sunday because of what happened while Jesus was praying on the mountain.

Emmett: I don't suppose this story involves a robot becoming a car?

Esther: No, but the story is about Jesus being transformed.

Emmett: Jesus became a car!

Esther: Oh Emmett! How about I just tell you the story?

Emmett: I'd love to hear the story about Jesus on the mountain.

Esther: Okay. As I said, Jesus went up a mountain to pray, but he didn't go up the mountain alone. Some of his friends – Peter, John and James – went with him.

Emmett: That's nice. Then they could all pray while they were on the mountain.

Esther: While Jesus was praying, he was changed!

Emmett: Jesus was changed! Are you sure he didn't become a car?

Esther: No. His clothes became a very bright white, like a very bright light.

Emmett: I hope his friends brought their sunglasses!

Esther: And then, two other people appeared on the mountain!

Emmett: Mountain climbers?

Esther: No, two people who had lived long ago and were known as prophets, as people who spoke about God and the world. They were Moses and Elijah.

Emmett: I've heard of them. There are stories about them in the Bible!

Esther: And they were also shining!

Emmett: How come everyone was shining?

Esther: When the Bible says that people were glowing, or shining like a bright light, it means that God is also there.

Emmett: Wow! This is a good story.

Esther: Jesus and Moses and Elijah talked about Jesus' life, and what would happen when he went to Jerusalem.

Emmett: Hey, what about Jesus' other friends – Peter and James and John? What were they doing?

Esther: The story says they all felt very tired....

Emmett: Don't tell me they fell asleep! How could anyone sleep when there were so many brightly glowing people around!

Esther: No, they didn't fall asleep. They listened and they saw Jesus and Moses and Elijah shining – showing God's glory. It was like God was shining a very bright light on them. And they saw Moses and Elijah getting ready to leave Jesus.

Emmett: And is that the end of the story?

Esther: No. Peter didn't want Moses and Elijah to leave, so he said that they should make three huts, three places for Jesus and Moses and Elijah to stay in.

Emmett: Why would they want to stay on top of a mountain? I mean, I'm sure there was a great view, but what would you do when you weren't praying?

Esther: I don't think Peter had really thought about what he was saying, but before he could say anything else, guess what happened?

Emmett: Did Peter fall asleep?

Esther: No. A thick cloud appeared and covered the mountain, and Elijah and Moses disappeared into the cloud!

Emmett: A cloud! How did that happen?
